Edmund Kirby Smith"

SPEAKER: Bob Grenier

Floridian Edmund Kirby Smith earned the unimaginative nickname "Seminole" from his West Point classmates in the Class of 1845. Though he was more interested in botany and biblical studies than in battlefield tactics, he earned two brevet promotions in the Mexican War. He spent the years leading to the Civil War in the 2nd U.S. Cavalry. When Texas seceded, Smith refused to surrender Federal installations to Benjamin McCulloch. He resigned his U.S. commission and accepted one in the Confederacy. Smith led a brigade at 1st Manassas, where he was seriously wounded. He recovered and was sent to the Western Theater and cooperated with Braxton Bragg in the 1862 Kentucky Campaign, after which he was transferred to the trans-Mississippi Department. Smith commanded this theater until the end of the war, earning the region the title of Kirby Smithdom.

Our speaker, Bob Grenier, a native of the Chicago area, comes to us from Tavares, Florida. He is retired from engineering services. Over the years, he has been President of the Lake County Historical Society and Museum, host for "Happenings and History" for WQBQ radio, executive director of the Tavares History Research Center, member of the Tavares City Council, Mayor of Tavares, and a cast member at Walt Disney World.

He is the author of twelve books on Florida history and is working on several more. Please join us for what promises to be an interesting presentation.

April 2025 Preservation Report by Brian Conroy

The Opportunity

Right now, an opportunity exists to protect nearly 210 acres of sacred battlefield land in Virginia — at Malvern Hill, Brandy Station, New Market, and New Market Heights. Through a remarkable \$6.44-to-\$1 match, contributions will go even further, ensuring that these irreplaceable sites remain untouched for current and future generations. The total value for this irreplaceable historic land is more than \$2.7 million, but fortunately, every dollar donated toward this goal will be multiplied, thanks to the anticipated government matching grants from the Commonwealth of Virginia, the federal government, committed partner groups, and some very generous supporters. The bottom line is: \$429,500 is needed to forever preserve these battlefield acres. Battlefields have already been lost to development. If action is not taken now, these landscapes — where history was written in blood and sacrifice — will disappear.

The History

Each of these Virginia battlefields tells a story of courage and determination.

- Malvern Hill (1862): The final battle of the Seven Days Campaign, where Union forces held their ground against relentless Confederate attacks. Without preservation, the battlefield's sweeping vistas could be marred by new construction.
- Brandy Station (1863): The site of the largest cavalry battle of the Civil War, marking a turning point for Union horsemen. Today, this historic land faces the threat of modern development.
- New Market (1864): The battle where young cadets from the Virginia Military Institute charged bravely into history, shaping the outcome of the war in the Shenandoah Valley.
- New Market Heights (1864): A battlefield where African American Union soldiers displayed extraordinary valor, with 14 men receiving the Medal of Honor. This land holds powerful lessons about bravery and the fight for freedom.

These are not just places on a map; they are places where the nation's story was written. If protection is not secured now, that story *may be erased*.

Stand for History Today

Too many irreplaceable historic sites have been lost. At Malvern Hill, a developer was prepared to build a massive home directly on battlefield land. Circumstances allowed for intervention in time. But relying on luck is not an option — dedicated supporters must take action. With the right help, these 210 acres of historic land can be *protected forever*. Every dollar contributed will be multiplied by \$6.44, maximizing impact and ensuring that future generations can stand on these battlefields and learn from the past.
