SPEAKER: Ron Carlson

We are all familiar with the higher-echelon generals of the Civil War, the army commanders who receive most of the credit and blame for success and failure. But there is a second tier of mostly unheralded generals without whom the war could not have been fought. One of these is Union General Alpheus Starkey Williams. The general was a native of Connecticut and graduated from Yale. He settled in Michigan. His chosen profession was law, but he also engaged in military affairs and led a regiment in the Mexican War.

At the onset of the Civil War, Williams was commissioned as a brigadier general in August 1861. He led a brigade and a division in the Shenandoah Valley. He led his division at Cedar Mountain, Antietam, Chancellorsville and Gettysburg before being transferred to the Western Theater. He served as a temporary corps commander but was never given a permanent title. Williams fought under Sherman throughout the Atlanta Campaign and the March to the Sea. After the war, he entered politics.

Our presenter, Ron Carlson, is a member of both the Salt Creek and Chicago CWRT's. Ron earned a B.S. from the Illinois Institute of Technology and an M.B.A. from Northwestern University and an M.A. in history from the University of Illinois at Chicago. For two decades, he taught American history at the College of DuPage, including several courses on the American Civil War.

## **January 2025 Preservation Report by Brian Conroy**

Not all trails are made the same — and when it comes to the Trust's 13 battlefield traits, you'll find that each serves as a gateway to the past. Situated upon battlefield land that the organization has worked tirelessly to protect, these unique paths bring hikers through the same terrain that Civil War soldiers would've traversed themselves. The experience can go beyond interpretive signage found along the trails, as the Trust has Battle App® guides available at several of the applicable sites, including Brandy Station, Chancellorsville, Fredericksburg, Gettysburg and Petersburg.

The Civil War Trust is pleased to announce the publication of *Civil War Battlefields: Walking the Trails of History*, a richly illustrated, 336-page coffee table volume showcasing the scenic beauty and recreational opportunities afforded by our nation's hallowed ground. The book was written by David Gilbert, who, many years ago, served as the very first editor of *Hallowed Ground*, when it was the membership publication of the Association for the Preservation of Civil War Sites. He was inspired to undertake the project while working as the editor and designer for a book by the Appalachian Trail Conservancy that looked at Civil War sites along its length and thought that a book taking a broader view would be well received.

"If not for the preservation efforts of the Civil War Trust and its many preservation partners, much of the land where American soldiers fought and died would be lost to development and largely forgotten," Gilbert said. "From the initial passion and energy of just a few dedicated individuals, it's heartening to see how much the Civil War preservation movement has grown, and the remarkable successes the movement has achieved. While much work remains to be done, it's gratifying to know that the Civil War preservation movement is in very good hands."
