Illinois Soldier Write About U.S. Grant"

SPEAKER: Mark Flotow

Civil War soldiers were the most literate soldiers in history in their time. They regularly read and wrote letters to remain in communication with friends and family at home. In their letters, they discussed every topic imaginable. These writings provide us with a real-time assessment of the Civil War as experienced by them. Discussions of service, camp life, and concern for the well-being of loved ones and local events flowed from their pens. They also wrote about their comrades and their commanders. Not surprisingly, Ulyssess S. Grant, under whom many of them fought, was a popular figure in their communications. Join us this month as Mark Flotow presents examples of how Illinoisans viewed the general who led them to victory.

Mark Flotow is an independent researcher after spending thirty years as a public health administrator, statistician, and demographer for the State of Illinois. He is an adjunct research associate in anthropology at the Illinois State Museum and volunteers as an interviewer for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library's Oral History Program. He contributes articles regularly to Illinois Heritage Magazine and is the author of the highly acclaimed In Their Letters, in Their Words: Illinois Civil War Soldiers Write Home
