TOPIC: "Andersonville" SPEAKER: Frank Crawford

Andersonville Prison, Camp Sumter as it was officially known, became after the Civil War one of the most famous places in United States History. Today over 150 years later, it remains such. Much is known about Andersonville as a prison and now it is the site of the National Prisoner of War Museum, but there is still new research and new information which is being carried on by both professional historians, assigned specific tasks to study and answer the many questions asked to the guides there and proper answers cannot be given. As well, amateur historians ask those questions of themselves. Websites, blogs and other "social media avenues" are available but not easily found and often contain half-truths, false information or, in today's terminology "fake news".

Frank Crawford, one of those amateur historians, has studied and collected stories about the site for almost 40 years. He has authored three books, two which contain some of those stories, as well as participated in marking of an Andersonville survivor's grave, the 100th anniversary historical commemoration of the State of Illinois Monument at Andersonville and assisted in the 150<sup>th</sup> burial ceremony for those 12,912 men that died at Andersonville but never had a funeral. Crawford is a retired Special Education instructor from Belvidere, Illinois High School, a twice past member of the Boone County Historical Society Board of Directors, serving four years as president of the board and a very proud recipient of the Daughters of the Confederacy's Jefferson Davis award.
